SWIFT STROKES ON SMOOTH WATER

This year's Blackburn Challenge was blessed with nearly perfect rowing conditions and was the fastest ever in many classes, but the fastest class of all was the sliding seat singles. Times that in the past would have been outstanding were about middle of the pack this year.

The competition was close and hard fought, with the first three places in men's singles all finishing in the same minute. The winner, Michael Dreher, from the Durham Boat Club, made it around in 2:43:10 rowing a 34 pound graphite fiber Jullien Rec Racer, and his time would have been better but this being his first trip around Gloucester, he was unfamiliar with the finish line and spent some time looking for it. Joe Holland in second place finished 35 seconds behind Dreher, and the previous record holder, Dana Gaines, another ten seconds back in third.

The match that held the most interest, however, for those in the know, was the women's race in sliding seat singles. Kinley Gregg and Jennifer Osborne in identical Alden Stars set out at a brisk pace, but half a mile into the race Jennifer contacted a channel buoy with one of her outriggers. At the time it seemed a minor brush and the two went on out the Annisquam River and around toward Halibut Point exchanging places as they went. But as they crossed Sandy Bay the minor bump came to maturity and the rigger on Jennifer's boat came adrift. While she was tightening the errant strut with an allen wrench, which she was wise enough to have with her, Kinley managed to open a lead that, try as she might, Jennifer was not able to close.

In a rowing race it has been my experience that once you have been passed by your competition and they have opened up a sufficient lead to be out of your immediate field of view in the quick glances that you take forward to check your course, your mind reaffirms to your fatigued body that you have been defeated, and the only encouragement to try harder is that which you give yourself. And in the next hour and a half Jennifer managed to give herself enough encouragement to keep the margin down to six minutes which, in the face of the circumstances and the caliber of competition that she faced, I judged to be a performance worthy of note. Next year she will be on guard for rogue buoys and the outcome will be interesting indeed.
